

## Microsoft Outlook phishing campaign

A new phishing campaign impersonates an official notification from the Microsoft Outlook team in an attempt to steal user account credentials from employees.

The notification claims to have been sent from Outlook on behalf of the recipient's company. The user is asked to “upgrade” their Outlook services within 24 hours, or email deliveries to them will be delayed.

The payload link is obfuscated by text and directs the user to a fake Outlook login page. This type of email instils a sense of urgency in the recipient, meaning they may be more likely to enter their details.
